Businesses of all sizes are at risk of fraud, and many SMEs are particularly vulnerable as time and resources are often scarce.

Consequences of fraud can be catastrophic for a business so being on guard is essential.

What is business fraud?

The intent or act of misrepresentation, scammers lying about themselves or their actions and services to cause a gain or loss (Metropolitan Police, 2019).

The Metropolitan Police have produced a guide to help SMEs to prevent business fraud and they offer ten top tips:

- Be Sceptical
 If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is!
- **2.** Know your business inside out
 So that you can recognise when something isn't right!
- **3.** Know your customers and suppliers Apply due diligence!

- 4. Identify areas where your business is vulnerable to fraud
 Are you an easy target?
- **5. Develop a strategy and talk about fraud** What are your controls and procedures?
- **6.** Take extra care about cyber attacks Protect your technology! (see overleaf)
- **7. Understand your finances**Know how to spot unusual transactions!
- **8.** Secure and protect your property
 Keep laptops, computers, smartphones and intellectual property safe!
- **9.** Develop an action plan Be prepared for the worst!
