Oxford Brookes University works with regional colleges to deliver university degrees closer to you.


So whether you are working and want to develop your skills, returning to education after a break, or wishing to delve deeper into a subject that you love, studying for an Oxford Brookes degree at one of our partner colleges might be right for you.

Students studying at our partner colleges come from a wide range of backgrounds. Many have worked for a number of years, while some have progressed straight from school or college. We look at all of your previous professional and academic experience when considering applications.



What is a foundation degree?

Many of the courses we offer through partner colleges are foundation degrees. A foundation degree is equivalent to the first two years of a traditional bachelor's degree, and includes plenty of work-based learning and industry specific skills. At the end of your foundation degree you can choose to 'top up' to a full bachelor's degree with an extra year of study.



Our partnership programmes at Solihull College & University Centre

Solihull College & University Centre, rated 'Good' by Ofsted in 2024, offers an extensive range of academic and vocational qualifications from entry to degree level, along with support services to help you achieve your goals. Courses are flexible, allowing you to fit your studies around work and/or family life. The college achieved Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF) Gold for its Higher Education provision in 2017 and is now rated TEF Silver after the merger with Stratford-upon-Avon College. The College was recently shortlisted for a Whatuni Student Choice Award in the 'FE College' category.

College locations and facilities

The college's Blossomfield Campus offers excellent facilities laid out over a pleasant site, with plenty of parking and good local transport links. Every student can access top-of-the-range IT resources, great catering outlets and a substantial library. The University Centre, solely for HE students' use, gives you the chance to relax and study away from the hustle and bustle of the wider college. The College's Woodlands campus offers a wide range of specialist technical facilities including our higher education Engineering provision.

Solihull College & University Centre has recently merged with Stratford-upon-Avon College, which also offers vocational courses taught by industry-experienced lecturers, preparing students for the professional workplace.

Why study at a partner college?



There are many reasons why you might choose to study at one of our partner colleges. Here are just a few:

1. Learning on your doorstep

Staying at home and studying can often be cheaper as well as more convenient, particularly if you plan to study alongside a career, or in between family commitments.

2. Variety and flexibility

Many of our courses have non-traditional class times and teaching styles. You may have evening lectures and be taught in a workshop or out in the field – rather than during the day in a traditional classroom.

3. Lower tuition fees

It can be cheaper to study at a partner college. For UK students studying an Oxford Brookes foundation degree at a partner college, tuition fees will be lower than our on-campus courses and you can access a loan which means you won't pay up front. Why choose an Oxford Brookes course?
